



### 1 Corn Exchange

Built in 1854 by public subscription as the town's Corn Market, this was the biggest indoor grain market in Scotland.

### 2 Former Cross Keys Hotel

Built in 1804, a popular venue for official banquets and balls. A public stagecoach service operated from here.



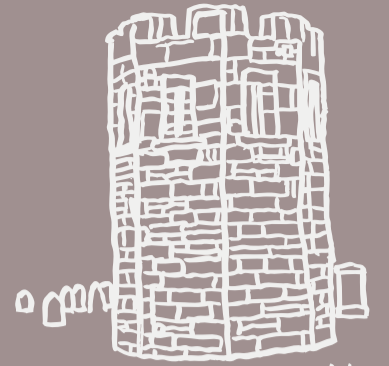

### 3 Dalkeith Tollbooth

Dating from the early 1700s this building was Dalkeith's weigh house, town court and prison. The town's last public hanging was here in 1827.

### 4 Watch Tower

Built in 1827 to accommodate armed watchmen looking out for grave robbers.

### 5 Old Council Chambers

Built in 1882 and extended in 1908 as the headquarters of Dalkeith Town Council until 1975.

### 6 Water Tower

Built in 1879 to store the town's water supply, the tank at the top of the tower could hold 12,000 gallons of water.
